What is the Toolkit

The *Toolkit for Responsible Artificial Intelligence Innovation in Law Enforcement* is a practical guide for law enforcement agencies on developing and deploying AI responsibly, respecting human rights and ethics principles.

Why do we need it

- AI is being increasingly adopted in law enforcement due to the unique opportunities it presents to support police work.
 - There is a lack of guidance on responsible AI innovation tailored for the specific context and challenges of law enforcement.
- If AI is not integrated responsibly, however, individuals and societies may suffer from negative impacts.
- The Toolkit bridges this gap and empowers law enforcement agencies to leverage AI while mitigating its risks.



When is it ready

The Toolkit V1.0 will be released in *June 2023*



What comes next

The Toolkit's roll-out will be complemented with capacity-building, training and certification for law enforcement agencies, as well as tailored support in the drafting of national law enforcement AI guidelines or strategies.

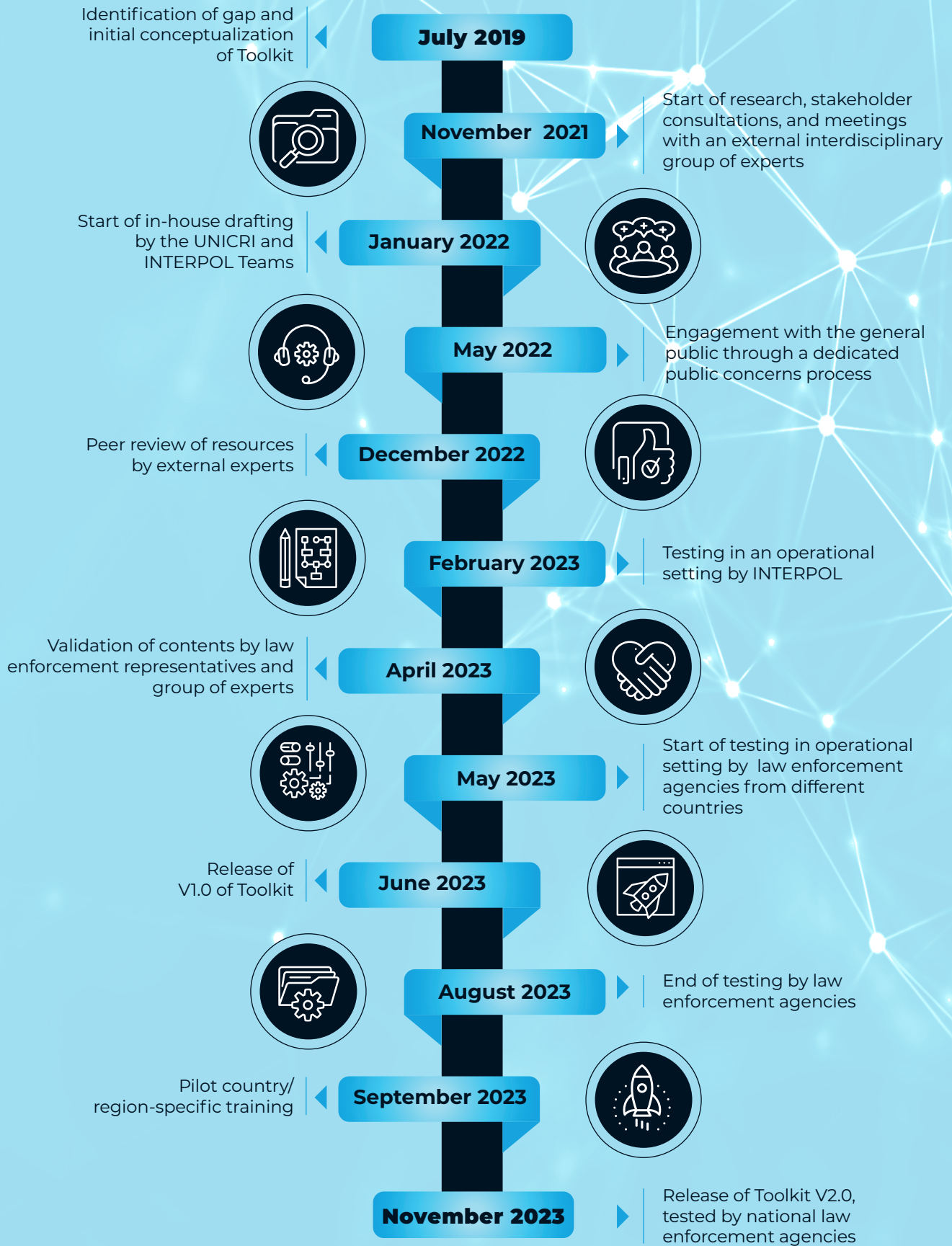
